

## Conditionals



Name	Form	Time	Function	Example
<b>First Conditional</b>	If + present + comma + will	Present / Future	For actions that are <b>likely</b> to happen. <b>High probability</b> 80% sure	If I <i>finish</i> my tasks on time, I <i>will</i> join you for lunch.
<b>Second Conditional</b>	If + past + comma + would	Present / Future	For actions that are <b>unlikely</b> to happen. <b>Low probability</b> 20% sure	If I <i>had</i> more time, I <i>would</i> do more sport.
<b>Third Conditional</b>	If + had + past participle (3 <sup>rd</sup> form) + comma + would + have + past participle	Past	To show that something is <b>too late</b> / a <b>past regret</b> .	If I <i>had</i> known that you were in Hamburg last week, I <i>would have</i> contacted you.
<b>Zero Conditional</b>	If + present + comma + present	Present	To show a certainty	If you <i>add</i> salt, the sweetness <i>decreases</i> .
